

## Hero's among us: Florence and Harold Summach

The College of Dentistry is honoured to recognize Florence and Harold Summach for their years of generosity. The Summachs ran a family footwear business, Lipsett's Shoes, in Saskatoon for over 30 years and loved to travel. Their longtime friends Murray and Gaylene Johnston described the store as a wonderful place to shop saying, "The Summachs were great folks and every visit was special."

The Summachs and Johnstons met and became great friends through their church community. The Johnston's son, Kirk, graduated from the College of Dentistry with distinction in May 1994 and began practicing dentistry in Weyburn, SK in June. While on a trip to the family's cottage for his 23rd birthday, Kirk was killed in a tragic car accident in August 1994.

Inspired by the Johnston family's actions to set up an award in Kirk's name and enable the College of Dentistry to assist other young individuals with the same aspirations as Kirk, the Summachs choose to generously donate to the award. After Harold passed away in 2003, Florence continued giving to the scholarship annually until she passed away in the fall of 2017.

The Summachs contributed to the Dr. Kirk Johnston Spirit of Dentistry Memorial Scholarship for over 25 years and more than 40 students have been impacted by their generosity and support. In order to continue this support beyond their lifetimes, Florence left a bequest to Dr. Kirk Johnston's memorial award on behalf of herself and Harold. Their generosity will reach many more dental students in the years to come and will continue to honour the memory of their friend's son. The college is humbled and grateful for Florence and Harold's kindness.


On Cho and his family at his White Coat Ceremony 2019
